

## CANDIDATE STATEMENT DAN COURTNEY

My occupation for the past twenty three years has been as an industrial real estate agent, working primarily in the Miramar, Poway and Kearny Mesa sub-markets. I also handle investment properties and own industrial property in Poway.

I have been a home owner in La Jolla Shores (.15 Floor Area Ratio) since 1994 and have been donating time to the La Jolla since 1998, when I was elected to The La Jolla Shores Association (LJSA).

I served four years on the LJSA including one year as Vice-Chairman and another year as Chairman.

I then served four years on The La Jolla Town Council including one year as 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President.

For the past three years I've served as a Trustee on The La Jolla Community Planning Association, and I'm asking for your vote to continue in this capacity.

I've also been active on multiple sub-committees and task forces, including four years on The La Jolla Traffic and Transportation Committee and I've worked on the Torrey Pines Road Safety Coalition.

My positions on several key issues impacting La Jolla include:
